

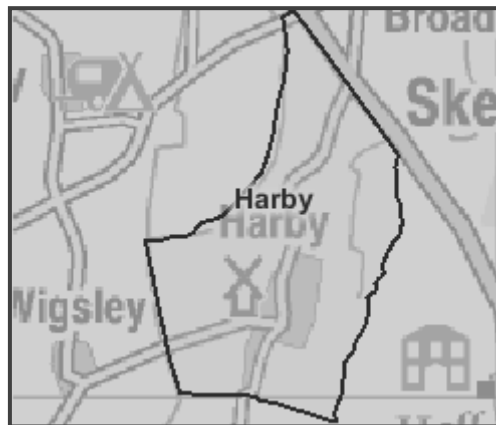

Harby Parish from the 2011 Census



Introduction

This document shares and explores some of the key data sets relating to Harby Parish, in Newark, Nottinghamshire from the 2011 Census.



Size and Households

Size

Harby is a small rural village which is 483 hectares in size. The 2011 Census showed Harby had a low population density of 0.7 which means there is less than one person per each hectare. For comparison Newark and Sherwood District had 1.8 people and England had 4.1 people per hectare.

Number of Properties

There were 128 properties in Harby an increase of 4% from 123 in 2001. This is a smaller increase than the 10% recorded for Newark and Sherwood and the 8% increase recorded for England.

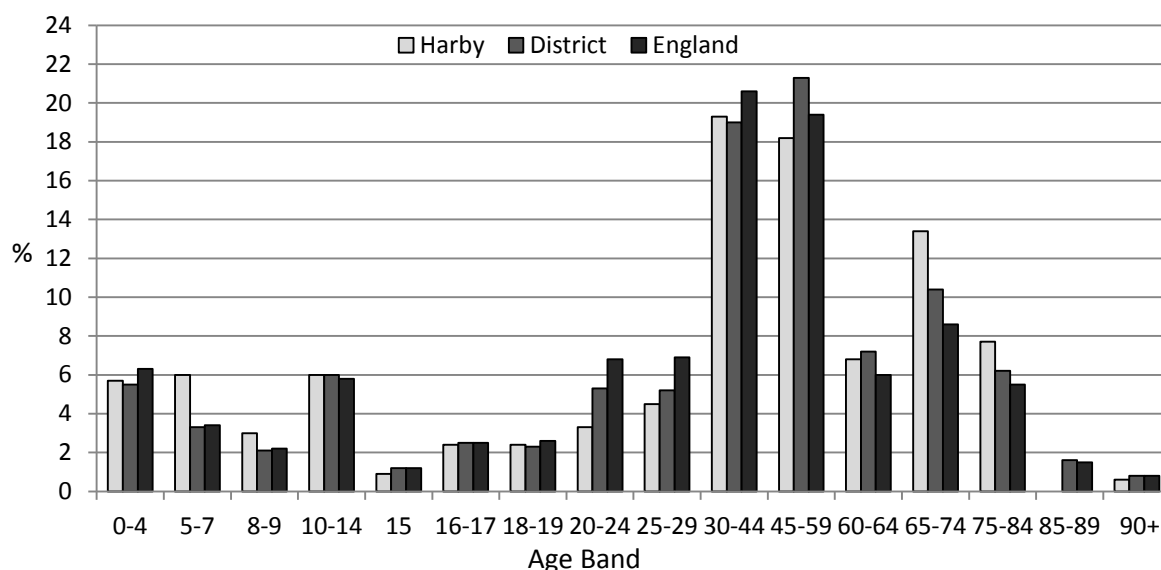
Residents

Population

336 people lived in Harby; this was a 16% increase from the 289 People who lived here in 2001. This was a larger increase than in Newark and Sherwood District (7%) and England (8%), over the same period (QS102EW).

Age of Residents

The age structure of Harby residents broadly followed the District and National pattern. There were some differences with Harby having a higher percentage of 5-9 year olds and 65-84 year olds. It was also slightly lower on the 20-29 year olds and 45-59 year olds (KS102EW).

Ethnic Group

97% of residents were White English, Welsh, Scottish, N.Irish or British. The remaining 3% of residents were 'Asian/Asian British; Other Asian' (1%), 'White Irish' (1%), 'Mixed/Multiple Ethnic Groups; White and Asian' (<1%), and 'White Other' (<1%). (QS201EW)

Religion

Harby had a high proportion of Christians (74%), compared to the District (66%) and National figures (59%). The overall breakdown is provided below (QS208EW):

Residents Country of Birth

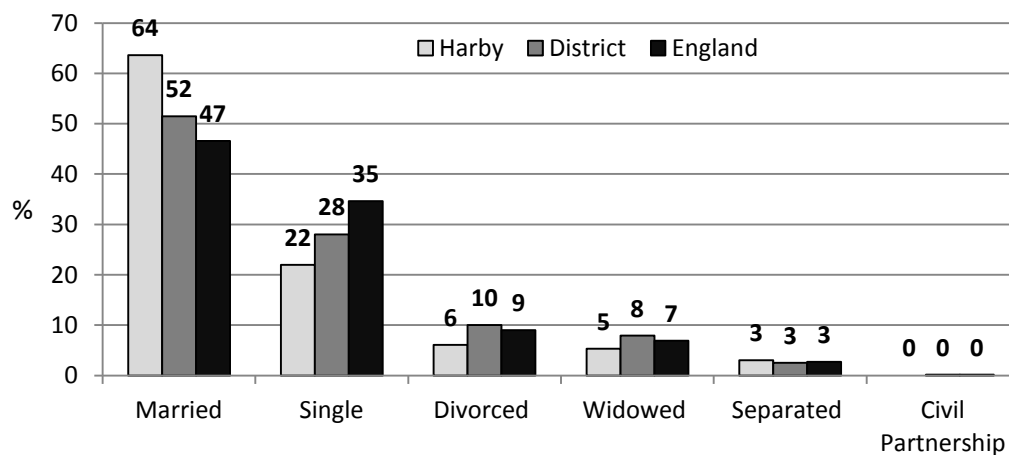
93% of residents were born in England; this was in line with the District (92%) figures but above the England figures (84%). 4% of residents were born in N.Ireland, Scotland and Wales.

1% of Harby residents were born in other EU countries; this was lower than the 3% and 4% recorded for the District and England. 2% of residents were born in other countries; this was comparable to the District figure, but lower than the 9% in England.

Marital and Civil Partnership Status

Harby has a higher proportion of married people (64%) and a lower level of divorced people (6%) compared to the District and England (6%) compared to the District and England (KS103EW).

Housing

Household Size

Although Harby has a low population density, it has a larger average household size of 2.6 people compared to the District (2.3) and England (2.4). Overcrowding is not a concern as it also has a higher average number of rooms per household (6.8) (including bedrooms, 3.3) than the Newark and Sherwood and England averages (KS403E).

Accommodation Type

Harby had a very high proportion of detached properties (70%), which was more than three times higher than England (22%) and as would be expected in a rural location, a low proportion of flats or apartments (QS402EW).

Tenure

Around three quarters of households are owned either outright or with a mortgage. Of these 38% are owned outright, which was 7% higher than the England figure. Around a fifth of the properties are social rented, with the majority of these being from the Local Authority, with Harby residents having a higher percentage of renting from the Local Authority (17%) compared to the District (10%) and England (9%) figures (QS405EW).

Central Heating

99% (127n) of households had central heating, with only 1 property having none. The majority of Harbys heating needs were met with oil, due to there being no access to mains gas.

Deprivation

Deprivation

The Census uses four areas (or dimensions) to indicate deprivation. These are:

1. Employment: Any member of a household, who is not a full-time student, is either unemployed or long-term sick.
2. Education: No person in the household has at least level 2 education, and no person aged 16-18 is a full-time student.
3. Health and Disability: Any person in the household has general health 'bad or very bad' or has a long term health problem.
4. Housing: Household's accommodation is either overcrowded, with an occupancy rating -1 or less, or is in a shared dwelling, or has no central heating.

Harby has slightly lower levels of deprivation in these dimensions compared to the District and nationally (QS119EW).

Economy and Work

Economy

76% of residents were economically active, with the remaining 24% being inactive. This was above the 69% of residents who were economically active in the District and the 70% in England. The breakdown of the figures is provided below for information (*QS601EW*):

Occupations

Harby broadly followed the District and National trends regarding the types of occupation residents worked in. The main difference was that Harby had slightly more managers, directors and senior officials (*KS608EW*).

Industries Residents Work in

Residents worked across the whole spectrum of industries. The highest proportion (20%) worked in 'wholesale and retail trade and the repair of motor vehicles/cycles.' This was higher than the District (17%) and National figures (16%).

Manufacturing was the second highest category at 14%, again slightly higher than the District (12%) and National figures (9%).

As would be expected in a rural area a higher proportion of residents worked in agriculture, forestry and fishing (6%) compared to the District (2%) and National figures (1%). However, this was still a relatively low figure considering Harby is traditionally seen as a farming community (KS605EW).

Car or Van Availability

92% of households (118n) had one or more cars/vans, up from 86% of households in 2001.

8% of households did not have a car or van in the household. This was much lower than the District (19%) and National figure (26%).

Harby also had a higher proportion of two or more vehicles in each household, compared to District and National figures (QS416EW).
