The Council object to the proposal: The proposed size of the turbine is too large for the landscape where it is proposed to be located and will have a disproportionate effect on the view as a result. There are already a number of approved applications for turbines in the area, including those which have now been built, which will have a cumulative effect on the landscape (4.2.3 and 4.2.4 Newark and Sherwood District Council, Local Development Framework Wind Energy Supplementary Planning Document). The proposed turbine is too close to a local resident's property.
