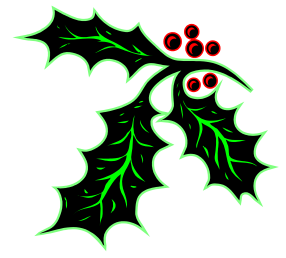
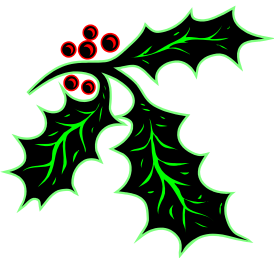

Harby Parish Council Update

As I write this, the last article for the year, the whole country has just emerged from lockdown again. Thankfully the children were in school this time round and students remained at college or university. There has also been several recent announcements that there are vaccines which are looking promising and that this virus will in the long term not be the killer that it has been this year, but it will take time for all the necessary authorisations to be given and then an immunisation programme to be rolled out to the whole of the country. Thanks therefore must go to everyone for doing their bit for helping to ensure that our community has experienced very few cases of infection, your assistance with ensuring that this remains the case until everyone has been vaccinated is greatly appreciated.

Once lockdown finishes, Nottinghamshire is once again being placed into Tier 3, but this means more new rules to understand as it is not the same as the tier 3 we were in previously. These rules will be in place until 16th December at the earliest, when the Government has stated a review will take place. There is also a 5-day window starting on 23rd December for small family/friends gatherings over Christmas, although caution should be taken. Whilst 3 households can meet for those 5 days, it is not a different 3 households on each day! Please consider carefully who you will meet up with. Whilst this festive season will be different from anything we have known before, we have to be mindful of everyone's safety. I hope that you make the most of whatever you decide to do.

This seems an appropriate point to thank all those volunteers who has gone the extra mile over recent months, to help a neighbour, do some extra shopping, pick up prescriptions etc. But let us not forget those key workers, who often have been forgotten, such as lorry driver, factory workers, farmers – without whom food would not have reached the shops and therefore our tables. There have been so many key workers (too many to mention) working extremely hard in the background to try and keep everything running throughout this year, with little or no recognition as they are not on the front line like the NHS – our thanks also must also go to them, for their hard work during this very difficult time.

Access to Faster Broadband

Are you struggling with slow speeds, does it seem to get slower and slower, when you would like it to get faster and faster? There may be an opportunity to get speeds in the village increased, but it is necessary to find out who is potentially interested in such a service. There are some subsidies available, but to achieve the greatest benefit, as many addresses as possible of who would like to access a faster service are required.
